A classroom-ready structure for age-appropriate background, discussion, comparison, and reflection.

Your Four-Step Starting Path

01

Prepare the context

Choose one text, define its place in the Ethiopian tradition, and identify the minimum background students need.

02

Lead with a story or question

Open with a concrete narrative moment or curiosity question rather than a list of unfamiliar names.

03

Compare carefully

Use a simple chart to distinguish canon lists or parallel themes without presenting one tradition as a caricature.

04

Close with reflection

Ask students to summarize the key idea, name one question, and connect the lesson to a familiar biblical theme.

Discussion and Reflection

- 1. What happened in the text?
- 2. What does the passage assume its first audience knew?
- 3. What is similar to a familiar biblical passage?
- 4. What is one responsible question for further study?

Suggested First-Month Plan

- Opening question - 5 minutes
- Context and reading - 15 minutes
- Small-group comparison - 15 minutes
- Reflection and prayer - 10 minutes

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
